

Habitats and areas: Tambor Bay, Tambor Beach, Panica River, Tambor



Mangroves, Finca Tambor Tropical, Los Delfines Wetlands, Panorama Ridge Trail (elevation 425 meters) Panorama High Ridge (elevation 700 meters) and the Panorama Flatlands.







Number of Species: 144





Significant Findings: The Yellow-faced Grassquit, not previously reported in the Dry NW Lowlands, was observed in an open area near the trail head of the Panorama Ridge Trail. Both the male and female were seen in the same place 3 days following the bird count. The original sighting was at 12:15 PM, December 30, 2012. Observed by Ruth Rodríguez and Larry Landstrom. Notes: This unofficial bird count was conducted in order to bring attention to the biodiversity Tambor and the surrounding areas have to offer bird watchers.
